

We have had a couple of short outages in recent weeks, but have been lucky enough to avoid anything too drastic so far. Nevertheless, we believe that we will be ready, should the worst happen.

In the meantime, the Emergency Team has grown, now numbering ten people with varying skills that we can draw on in the event of a major emergency.

We receive information on this scheme from time to time from its organiser, Julie Greenslade. The scheme evolved from the provision put in place during Covid, and now provides a range of services for the Upper Dales area.

These include the **Community Hub in Hawes** which is open for three days a week on **Mondays, Tuesdays and Fridays from 10.00 am to 3.00 pm,** for a cup of tea and a chat, or help and support with energy/fuel costs, computer use and accessing services online.

On the first Monday of the month, **Carers Plus, Citizens Advice and MIND** offer free advice, or the opportunity to make an appointment for more confidential advice.

A range of other services and assistance is also available including food support, a Carer's Break Service, and the Upper Dales Home Care Service.
